Q. Where can I get tickets?

- **In person** – Lottery tickets are available for purchase in person at the Box Office at Confederation Centre for the Arts (130 Queen Street, Charlottetown, at the corner of Queen Street and Grafton Street) and at a Lottery Sales Desk during select events.
 - **BOX OFFICE HOURS:** Monday through Saturday: 10am-5pm; Sundays & Evening Performances: The Box Office opens 2.5 hours prior to each performance.
- **Online** – Purchase your Confederation Centre Lottery ticket(s) online at confederationcentre.com/lottery.
- **Phone** – Call our Box Office at 1-800-565-0278 (local 902-566-1267).
- **Mail** – Print and fill in the order form from our website and send it with a cheque made out to:

Lottery tickets purchased online or via telephone will be confirmed via email. If you would like the physical ticket(s), you may pick up at the box office or have an envelope mailed to you for a small fee (a \$2.00 charge will be added to your total order).

Q. What methods of payment do you accept?

Cash, cheque, debit, or credit card (MasterCard, Visa, American Express, and Diners Club). Confederation Centre of the Arts gift cards and ticket vouchers may not be redeemed for lottery tickets.

Q. When are tickets on sale?

Tickets are available from 10:00 a.m. on Friday, June 28, 2019 to approximately 10:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 27, 2019, or while supplies last.

Q. What are the odds of winning?

Only 500 tickets will be available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Odds will depend on number of tickets sold, and number of tickets purchased by each individual.

Q. Do I have to put a proper name on my ticket?

Yes, that is how we will legally determine who has won the prize, however the winner is able to do as they wish with the prize.

Q. Can I put more than one name on a ticket?

Yes. Up to two names may be on one ticket, as long as both meet eligibility requirements. We can only speak regarding the prize to the winner(s) listed on the ticket, so a couple might want to put both names on their ticket.

Q. If I buy tickets, can I get a tax receipt?

Lottery tickets are non-tax deductible in accordance with Canada Revenue Agency policies. You can, however, make a donation in addition to your ticket(s) purchase and receive a tax receipt for the donation portion of your order if your donation exceeds a minimum of \$25.

Q. If I live off-island but am visiting, can I still buy tickets?

Yes, non-residents may purchase tickets in person at Confederation Centre of the Arts. Only those with a valid Prince Edward Island mailing address may purchase via telephone or online.

Q. What if I lose my ticket? What if there is a spelling or address error on my ticket?

We will keep a master file of the ticket holders with the names and numbers of each ticket holder, which will be recorded at the time of purchase. If you lose your ticket, or need to correct an error on your ticket, please contact the Confederation Centre Box Office at 1-800-565-0278 or email info@confederationcentre.com for direction on reprinting.

Q. Where does the money go?
